Approval of 1/3/22 Minutes

Lisa Napolitano

- A. Agenda and minutes were emailed to the Board in advance of today's meeting.
- B. Recommended changes to the past minutes: no changes.
- C. Lisa made a motion to approve the minutes. Approved and seconded: Jean and Dan.

Treasurer's Report

Maryanne Andrews

- A. Financial reports were emailed to the Board in advance of today's meeting.
- B. As of 12/31/21:

Checking: approximately \$94,000 Money Market: approximately \$80,000 Net Income: approximately \$32,000

C. As of 1/31/22:

Checking: approximately \$100,000 Money Market: approximately \$80,000 Net Income: approximately \$6,000

- D. Maryanne is working on actual vs budget.
- E. Lisa made a motion to approve the financial reports. Approved and seconded: Leslie and Jean.

President's Report

Lisa Napolitano

- A. Casey Key Association Annual Meeting 1/19/22
 - 1. The Oaks Club was a great venue.
 - 2. Zoom went well for some. It did not record well. It gave people an option.
 - 3. Caroline thanked Lisa for putting together the directory for annual meeting.
 - 4. Lisa thanked Dan and Janet for their work on the directory.
 - 5. Revised directories are available to order on the CK website until 4/1/22.
- B. Casey Key Shoreline Resiliency Project (SRP)
 - 1. Lisa said there's still a lot more work to do, due to the complex process of the county.
 - 2. Dan asked the pilot program with reef balls. Lisa said it's the Reef Ball Foundation's demonstration project.
- C. Casey Key Road Repairs at North Key Revetment (500-700 Block of North Casey Key Road) and Mid Key Bluff (2104-2120 Casey Key Road): County road project
 - 1. Spencer Anderson provided an update at the annual meeting, and that's all we have to date.
 - 2. Mary Dee said there was going to be an opportunity for a public hearing in March.
 - 3. Mary Dee said, and Lisa agreed, that we should have the county road project on the agenda for the next meeting.
 - 4. Mary Dee said the maintenance people have looked at the road, but we don't have clarity about exactly what is happening when. Mary Dee will speak with Dennis Doughty.
 - 5. Mary Dee said the county has not been holding the public meetings.

Security

Dawn Doughty

- A. January incident report: not yet received. There are staffing changes at the Sheriff's Office.
- B. 2021: 44 actual crimes. Approx. 500 incidents. Approx. 70% occurs at public parks.
- C. Dan said that the Sheriff said we were better off in 2021 than 2020. Dawn agreed: it was over 600 the previous year.
- D. Dawn said one day a week we should have an unmarked vehicle. We are having trouble getting the unmarked vehicles. The staff are at training.
- E. Volunteers for a security committee were discussed.
- F. Dawn mentioned that the Legacy Trail map has CK on it, even though CK is not part of the Legacy Trail.
- G. Leslie asked about the cycling rules at the bridge. Dawn said there's no statute or enforcement behind it. However, police can monitor the stop sign violations.
- H. March staffing for Sheriff's Department is challenging due to spring break and a professional day. They also have to staff for spring training games and the Sarasota County Fair. So, we might not get all of our shifts staffed.
- I. Signage on CK
 - 1. Some are rusted, missing, down.
 - 2. We have a petition to the county to have 4-5 of them installed around CK: lighted electronic speed limit signs. The exact locations have not yet been determined, but the idea is to put them

where people speed the most, such as straightaways, as well as throughout CK. They cost approximately \$4K per sign.

- 3. People should cut back vegetation, if possible.
- 4. South Casey Key submitted a petition with 80 signatures, including improved signage for South Casey Key.

The Sarasota County traffic engineer Amjed Hussain was supposed to do a study, considering reducing the limit to 20, rather than 25.

They are also looking at Kids at Play signs.

J. James Grim asked about road humps. Dawn said Sarasota County suspended their traffic calming measures in 2007 for the benefit of emergency vehicles to have flat roads and access.

K. Security Cameras

- 1. Dawn is not endorsing any company nor the use of security cameras.
- 2. Dawn suggested forming a committee to explore cameras.
 - Dawn questioned to what extent security cameras will increase security here.
 - Lisa mentioned that the cameras have to be on a pole and placement is important.
 - Lisa said that we need to have a holistic security policy.
 - Mary Dee asked if the security committee would work on cameras. Dawn said that the camera issues should be a separate issue. Mary Dee suggested the exploration of the cameras within the context of the other security issues.
 - Dawn mentioned that it's dependent on our relationship with Sarasota County.
- 3. Dawn spoke with Flock Security: the only security camera company that Dawn has reviewed.
 - Sarasota PD has used Flock for years, and Sarasota PD likes the actionable evidence.
 - The Flock camera is solar, not dependent on hard wiring (cloud based), still images, a limited number of images per day.
 - We would own the data, but we would not own the cameras.
 - It's basically an alert system. The Sheriffs would get a notice if a predator is on the key, but that does not mean that the Sheriff's Office responds to that alert.
 - It would not impact speeding.
 - Flock allows residents to opt out of the system.
 - There's no one who monitors it. It's just recorded. We would need to perform any search.
- 4. Dawn asked Lisa if she had received anything from Current Technologies. Lisa had not.
- 5. Clayton did a test with a camera, and it was tough to read the license plates. It was not effective, especially with faster vehicles.
- 6. Lisa thanked Dawn.

Membership and Online Directory

A. Membership data

 - Janet writes them a hand-delivered personal note.
 - Dan mentioned that it is particularly important this year, because we want people to participate in SRP.
- E. Terry mentioned that she knew of some neighbors who contributed to SPR but are not CKA members.

- Leslie said she'd handle it, and Janet said she'd help.
